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Eligibility Requirements & Decision

- Required attendance at all intake and orientation(s)
- Be at least 16 and 9 months old and no longer attend an lowa High School
- Applicant must not have a US recognized HS Diploma
- Applicant must be unenrolled from High School
- Eligibility decision happens after the CASAS test is taken

What makes a good enrollment?

- Individuals who are willing to make changes in life that will improve their chances of getting or keeping a job
- Individuals who are committed to attend 2-4 days per week depending on class chosen
- Individuals who are committed to complete homework outside of class
